**Drini i bardhë/Beli Drim gorge** (White Drin) is located in the central part of the region, at the midpoint of the Drini i Bardhë/Beli Drim waterfall. The gorge is a hydrological and geomorphological phenomenon. However, the sharpness of the incision and the depth of the gorge were also determined by subsequent tectonic movements. It has features typical of gorges and runs through Upper Cretaceous carbonate formations. The Drini i Bardhë/Beli Drim gorge was, in 1986, declared a natural monument of hydrological and geomorphological value. The area surrounding the gorge totals 198.82 ha.

**Radoniqi/Radonići lake** is an artificial lake in the municipality of Gjakovë/Đakovica, created in the 1980s. Its name derives from the village that was flooded when the lake was created. This reservoir supplies water to about 214,000 people living in the towns of Gjakovë/Đakovica, Rahovec/Orahovac and surrounding villages. Its surface area is 5.96 km<sup>2</sup>. The capacity of the reservoir is 113 million m<sup>3</sup>, providing plenty of water all year round. Radoniqi lake provides a rich habitat for flora and fauna.

**Shkugëza /Škugeza** is a hilly area situated between 325 and 401 m above sea level. It lies southwest of the town of Gjakovë/Đakovica. The river of Shlepica flows through the middle of the Shkugëza park all year round. Shkugëza covers an area of 67.40 ha. The park is important as a habitat for flowers, plants and animals. Much of the wooded part consists of coniferous trees, of which the main one is pine. The varied natural biotopes of Shkugëza offer suitable living conditions for a considerable number of birds and animals which are widely found in the park: foxes, squirrels, hedgehogs, blackbirds, magpies, sparrows, woodpigeons, falcons, etc. The Shkugëza park has been placed under legal protection in the “protected panorama” category, with a designated surface area of 69 ha.
