Mark Rrustem Jakaj's tower was built on the foundations of an older building dating from the 19th century. Construction started in 1919. The tower has some of the traditional features of buildings of this kind: it has two storeys, a skylight (dormer window), chimneys, turret embrasures, casement windows, a wooden ceiling and brick walls. Inside there are wooden cupboards, carpets, scatter rugs, goatskin rugs, cushions. The wooden staircase on the outside of the tower leads directly to the upper floor, i.e. to the guest room. Inside the tower, there are wooden stairs on the lower floor leading to the other parts of the premises.

Private museum was built in 1906. The tower in which the museum is located displays some traditional features. It is a two-storey building built of fired and sun-baked bricks, with wooden stairs leading inside. The windows and outside doors are semi-circular. There is a skylight (trapdoor), a chimney, a goatskin rug, and a lattice window. The tower has been in use as an archaeological and ethnographic museum since 1972, with a variety of exhibits on show. Some of the exhibits (e.g. lachrymatory, ceramic pipes) date back to 6000 BC.
