**The Mirusha gorge and waterfalls** are located on the lower part of the river of the same name, around 2 km from Dush/Duši village, Grapc village, Llapqeva/Lapçevo and the Hill of Dushi. In 1983 an area of 555.80 ha including the Mirusha gorge was declared a Regional Nature Park. The gorge is the most interesting and beautiful part of the Mirusha river. As well as offering beautiful sights and morphology, the gorge is an outstanding area because of its 13 lakes and 12 waterfalls of differing shapes and heights, running through upper Cretaceous limestone formations. It is at its widest at the final lake, while the narrowest part is in the area of the fourth lake, where it is also deepest, between cliffs 200 m high. At certain points along the gorge lie small lakes, connected to each other by waterfalls. They vary in shape and size according to their position, and the structure and lithological composition of the limestone.

**Azem Bejta-Galica's cave** is located in the northern part of Përçeva/Prcevo village, close to the main road which connects Pejë/Peć with Prishtinë/Priština, at an altitude of 612 m. It has not yet been explored, but it is known as Azem Bejta-Galica's cave because it is here that the brave freedom fighter's bones were hidden. In the limestone area around the cave there are also surface karstic formations, but there is no surface hydrographical network. The areas around the cave are covered in vegetation and bushes (*Quercus sp*) and black hornbeam (*Ass.: Carpinetum orientalis scardicum*). According to local sources, the entrance to the cave is very narrow. The cave comprises a vertical shaft around 70 m deep, 0.60 - 1.5 m wide, leading to a horizontal extension through which it is possible to walk. The cave is rich in crystals and is also assumed to be rich in stalactites and stalagmites.

**The Dushi cave** is located in the northern part of the Mirusha river gorge in Dushi/Duši village. The cave entrance is located at the end of a seasonal creek, and lies at an altitude of 516 m. This is an area of Cretaceous rudist limestone which is quite extensive in the Mirusha river basin, and there are various kinds of karstic formations around the Dushi/Duši Cave, including ponds, blind valleys and karstic fields covered in vegetation and bushes (*Quercus sp*). The entrance to the cave faces south-east and measures 8.40 m in width and 12.60 m in height. The total length of passable channels is around 500 m. It is rich in stalactites, stalagmites and columns of different shapes and sizes, with large numbers of bats living inside (*Rhinolophus ferrumequinum*, *Rh. blasii*, *Eptesicus serotinus*).
